Home of New England's largest stratified drift aquifer.

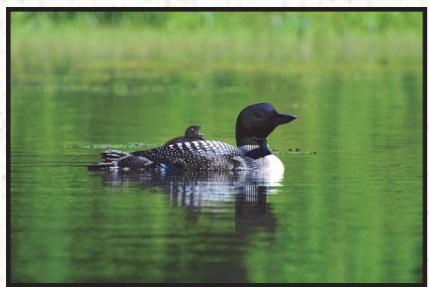

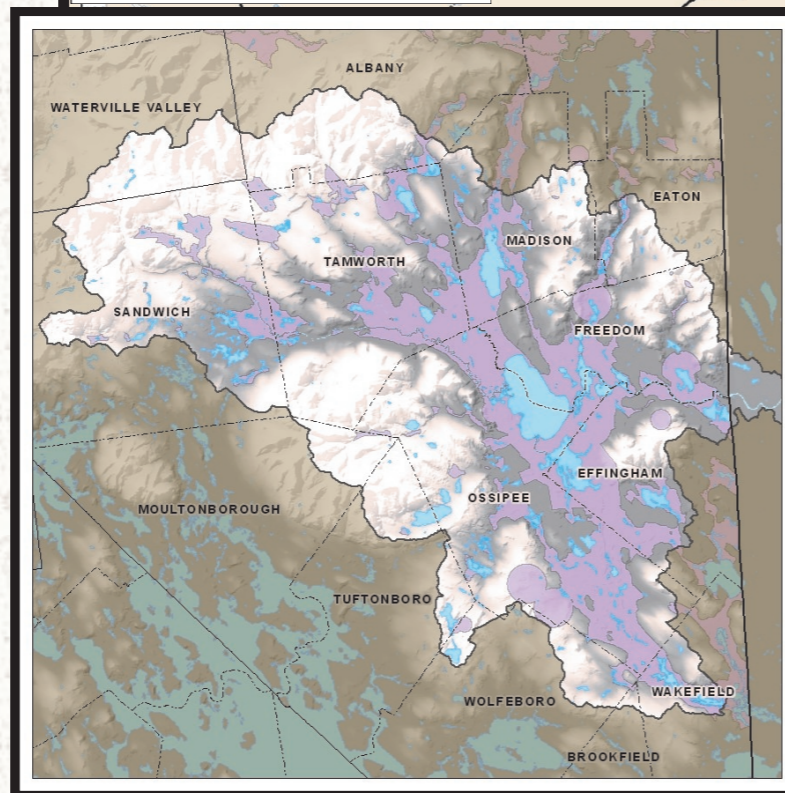
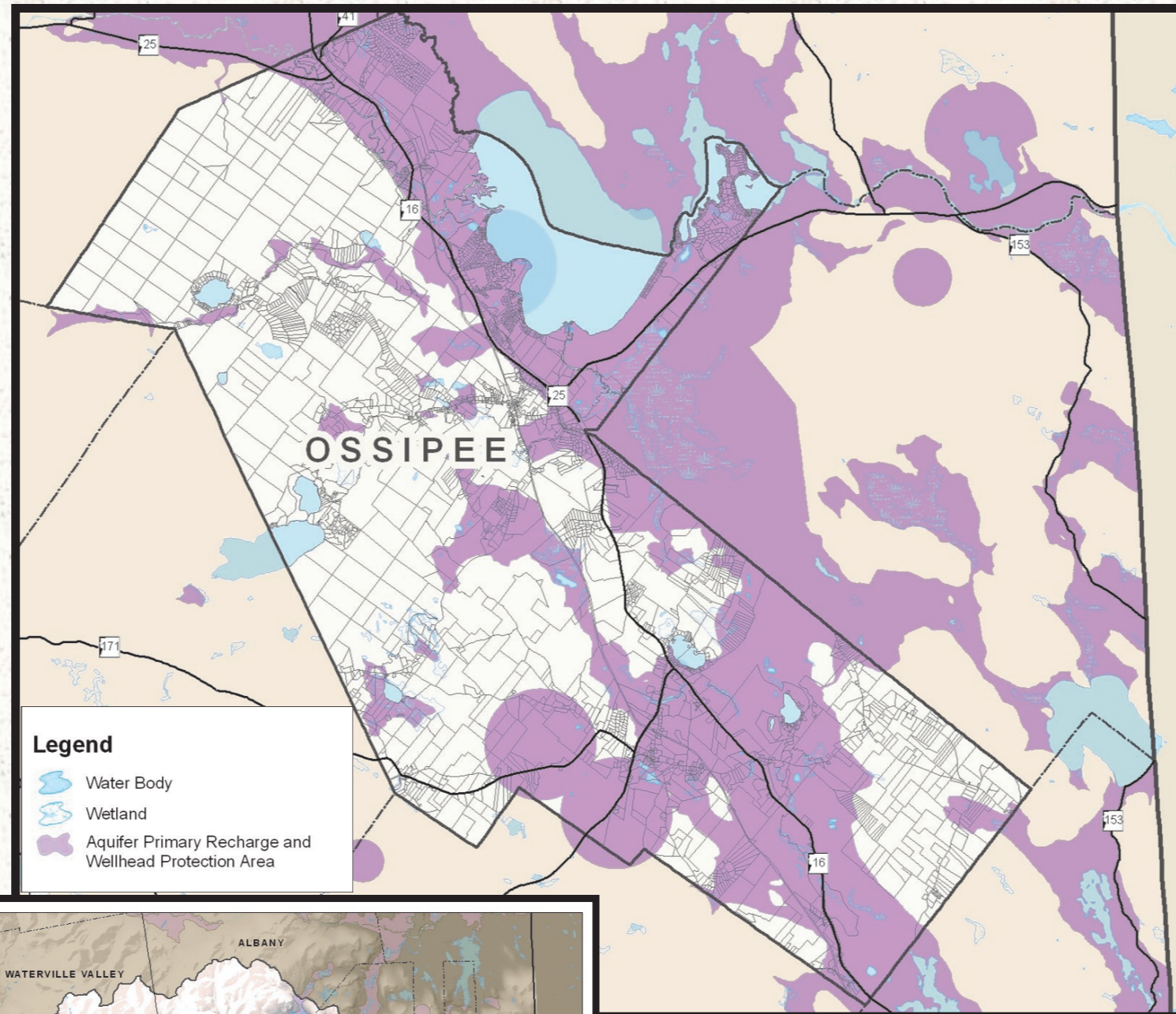
